



No fun at ruined playground

When little Maru Timoti moved to Mangere East with her family, her eyes lit up as she spied the Cottingham Reserve playground close to her new home.

But the 3-year-old's father, Sonny, quickly decided there was no way his precious daughter would play there.

Mr Timoti says the state of the Cottingham Reserve playground is a disgrace. Littered with broken glass, sharp pieces of metal and melted plastic toys, he says it is unsafe for children.

Repeated vandalism during the past five years has meant basic play equipment like swings, slides and a flying fox have been removed.

"It's been absolutely destroyed," says Mr Timoti. "Playgrounds are supposed to be a fun place but kids playing here will just get cut up and hurt."

Mr Timoti's Cranmere Crescent neighbours agree.

Sue Romana has lived next to the reserve for 23 years and says she bought a trampoline and swing set for her backyard so the children in her care don't have to go to the playground.

Ms Romana says teenagers who hang around the reserve and damage the equipment are a danger.
